A little girl discovers the power of the creative impulse. A woman remembers her first confusing sexual encounter. An aging flower child travels to Mexico to save her daughter. A baby is born with blue feet. A man ponders his ex-wife's last word. Those who live in the pages of *Circus Girl & Other Stories* are seeking—wisely or foolishly, successfully or vainly—to make sense of their lives and to become more completely themselves. For some, the self-examined life leads deeper into darkness; others find the crack in their universe that lets the light in.

Wonderful stories, each with a clear and distinct narrative voice. There is a great depth of humanity in the characters, in part because Abraham does a good job of writing against type, but what I love most in these stories is the humor. Abraham, like all the best writers, reminds us that the great tragedies and profundities of the human condition are often wed to absurdities of our situation and our own ridiculous and feckless behaviors. There is genuine heartache here, and I was laughing aloud through most of it. Definitely add this collection to your list.

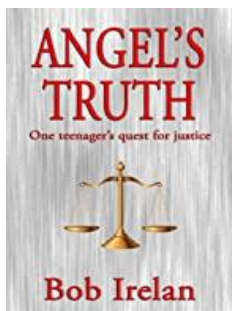

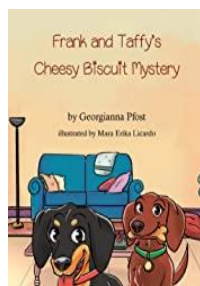

## From the Book Shelf

### **Trip To Berastagi, Sumatra, Indonesia Circa 1978**

When my husband, Bob came home from the field, at the end of his work period, the first thing he did, besides kissing me hello, was take a shower. He was eager to wash off the sweat and heat of the Banda Aceh jungle where he worked for Mobil Oil. He had nine days at home in Medan.

Our favorite restaurant was a Chinese place that had the absolute best sweet-and-sour ribs. Later, a co-worker with Bob told us the ribs were from dogs. We didn't believe him—at first.

On one break field we and another couple, Carol and Mike, went to Berastagi in the Karo Highlands, north of Medan. Our destination was a rest house that was once the summer home of a Dutch official when Sumatra was a colony. Mobil used it as a vacation rental, but employees were welcome to visit the grounds.

On the way there, we passed through Berastagi, which means Rice House. We climbed higher after going through the small city and I was gifted with the sight of seven or eight volcanic cones that dotted the huge plain below. I wanted to stop and stare, but no one else was interested.

The house was set in the foothills of Sinabung, an active volcano. The volcano was issuing white steam from the long crack in the side of the mountain that day. Watching the steam from a live volcano was better than staring at dead cones.

The Highlands were not as hot and humid as Medan. We'd brought a picnic and spent the afternoon in lawn chairs, enjoying the drier and cooler weather.

When we drove back through Berastagi, our driver mentioned—oh so casually—that Berastagi was where the dog markets were.

“Oh,” Carol said. “You mean a pet market? We could stop and buy a puppy?”

“You could,” he said. “But no, these older dogs, they for food.”

Carol made a disgusted sound, and Bob and I grinned at each other. We were thinking of our favorite Chinese restaurant and the delicious ribs.

So, did we stop going to the restaurant? No. Our friends stopped eating the ribs, but Bob and I still ordered them. They may have been, and probably were dog, but they were too delicious to give up.


